1. Area of Emphasis Description:

This emphasis foregrounds the interplay between language, literature, and the social spheres in which they are embedded. Students will acquire linguistic and literary competence in one or more Asian languages, and examine how texts, discourses, and language practices reflect cultural identities, social structures, and historical change across East Asia. Through courses in sociology, anthropology, history, media studies, and cultural theory, the emphasis fosters a holistic understanding of how language and literatures operate in real social contexts.

Objectives:

On completing of the major with this emphasis, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate advanced proficiency in an Asian language (Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Vietnamese).
- Read and analyze literary, cultural, and media texts in the target language(s), engaging with both traditional and contemporary genres.
- Articulate how language and literature are embedded in social, cultural, political, and historical contexts, and critically evaluate the relationship between linguistic practices and structures of power, identity, and community.
- Integrate methods and theoretical perspectives drawn from the social sciences and cultural studies into language- and literature-based research.
- Prepare for careers or further graduate work in fields where cultural, linguistic, and social literacy are essential, such as translation, cultural heritage, diplomacy, media, international development, and academia.
