1. Area of Emphasis Title: Master of Music with an Emphasis in Music Therapy with Equivalency

2. Area of Emphasis Description:

The Master of Music (M.M.) with an Area of Emphasis in Music Therapy with Equivalency (Non-Advanced Standing) is designed for students who do not hold an undergraduate degree in music therapy. This program provides comprehensive foundational training to prepare students for entry into the field and eligibility for the board certification exam. Following the required internship, students continue with advanced coursework that mirrors the curriculum offered to those in the “Advanced Standing” track for students who already possess a Bachelor’s degree in Music Therapy. These studies include in-depth exploration of clinical practice, research methodologies, and current developments in the field of music therapy. Students are required to have an undergraduate degree in music to apply for this track. Students with a bachelor’s degree in music therapy should complete the advanced standing track of this degree.

Coursework will address the Professional and Advanced Competencies in Music Therapy as established by the American Music Therapy Association. Primary career opportunities for graduates of this degree program include the advanced practice of music therapy in a variety of healthcare and educational settings, supervision in music therapy, and teaching music therapy at the undergraduate level. The degree also prepares graduates for future study in music therapy at the doctoral level.

At the conclusion of this track students complete a graduate project in music therapy that is a non-thesis, non-research-based project. This project is based in expanded implementation and development of clinical practice.

In order to apply for this track the following conditions must be met:

- Bachelor of Music or Bachelor of Arts in Music
- Your GPA is 3.0 or higher in undergraduate music classes.
