

Franklin College Faculty Senate
Minutes of the meeting on Tuesday, October 21, 2025

Approval of the minutes of the August 19, 2025 meeting: The minutes were unanimously approved without corrections.

President Carmen Comeaux's Remarks:

Carmen Comeaux began the meeting.

Dean Stenport's Remarks:

Dean Stenport thanked the senate leadership and senators for their service.

Dean started with good news: **Franklin College is authorized to conduct nearly 50 faculty searches beginning in August 2026**, mostly for tenure-track positions, with some non-tenure-track roles as well. The Dean expressed appreciation for the strong support received from the President and Vice President for Instruction.

Dean Stenport noted that **H-1B visa restrictions are not effective for those already residing in the United States.**

Dean reported that **undergraduate headcount is down 4.1% for Fall 2025**, continuing a steady decline. The Dean's Office will continue to assess trends and work with academic program directors to increase enrollment. **New undergraduate enrollment** is down **6.1%**, and **graduate enrollment** is down **4.2%**, with the largest decrease among master's students due to visa issues affecting international students. Efforts are underway to increase domestic graduate enrollment.

Dean Stenport mentioned **ongoing uncertainty in federal funding** (e.g., NSF, NIH). A clearer picture is expected by February 2026, and department heads and directors have been informed.

The college have launched two task forces for the year 25-26 to look specifically at how we are coordinating and serving our students in the division of biological sciences which is the largest undergraduate program. There is a task force led by Karen that will report in the end of January. There is also a task force in Language. This task force is led by Chad Howe from linguistics to strengthen the language education environment. There will be a report for that work in November.

Franklin College achieved **a record number of Study Away and Study Abroad enrollments for Summer 2026**, and the Dean thanked faculty for developing these programs.

The new **General Education Core Curriculum** will launch in **Fall 2027** and will include significant changes. A new **Ethical Decision-Making** requirement will be introduced, requiring the development of many new courses. **Paula Lemons** is leading efforts to support the creation of ethics-related courses, which may also apply to other disciplines. There will also be a new **Global** category.

Remarks on faculty education. Faculty development support service called the National Center for Faculty Development and Diversity (NCFDD). UGA has a paid subscription. Encourage all faculty to involve in it and get benefit from it.

Faculty Advisory Committee elections will be announced soon, selecting ten faculty members representing five divisions.

Dean and Associate dean have asked the department to provide a brief update on some of their academic innovation work that they have been doing in the department. Dean's office will schedule various meetings with faculty categories, sharing feedback and ideas.

The Dean's Office will host **"cookie conversations"** on **Monday, November 17 at 2:00 PM** and a **holiday open house on December 1**.

Dean's office will call for proposal for philanthropically supported research development that started in the college. These are both funding grants for multidisciplinary team-based projects and individual faculty professional development awards. Those calls will be launched December 1. They'll be due early in the spring. Invite everyone to join in on Spotlight on the Arts.

The Franklin college has received a three-million-dollar award from the Marcus Foundation, specifically to design and explain it to learn from students in the Franklin College who are interested in enhancing their entrepreneurial mindset.

As of January in 2026, all **course syllabi must be uploaded by January 5** to ensure 100% compliance. More information about that will come soon. For 2026 enrollment, this information should be available by the time of registration.
