We have also included the Major Requirements (as instructed by the new proposals) and a version of our Bulletin with the proposed terminations removed (as instructed by the termination proposals).

### Program Abstract:

The area of emphasis in English Language Studies allows students to focus their studies on linguistics and language classes.

### 1. Why is this area of emphasis being proposed for termination?

At the time that this Area of Emphasis was created, many Linguistics faculty were members of the English department. Since that time, Linguistics has become its own separate department, so Linguistics classes are no longer offered by the English department. and the Area of Emphasis coursework is no longer supported.

### 2. What will be done to ensure that termination of the area of emphasis does not weaken the major(s) under which it is offered?

Students interested in linguistics and language are well served by the many classes offered by the Linguistics department.

### 3. How will faculty and staff be notified of the termination? Will termination of the area of emphasis have any impact on the faculty and staff offering the area of emphasis?

Faculty and staff have already been notified; this change was approved unanimously by the English Department. Terminating the Area of Emphasis will have no impact on faculty or staff.

### 4. How will students be notified of the termination? How will students currently in the area of emphasis be advised to complete the requirements?

Currently, no students are enrolled in this Area of Emphasis. Should any be enrolled at the time of termination, the English undergraduate office will contact any affected students individually. Students hoping to combine their studies in English with a focus on Linguistics will be advised to consider a Linguistics minor.

### 5. What plans, if any, are there for subsequent reactivation of the area of emphasis?

The included revised Bulletin removes all four Areas of Emphasis being proposed for termination: Eighteenth-Century Literature, Rhetoric and Composition, Humanities Computing, and English Language Studies.

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## **MAJOR REQUIREMENTS**

A baccalaureate degree program must require at least 21 semester hours of upper division courses in the major field and at least 39 semester hours of upper division work overall. Students in the Franklin College must earn a grade of "C" (2.0) or better in major required courses.
